



Compliance Statement for DRC Conflict-Free products.

Reference: Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, Section 1502, reporting requirements for conflict minerals.

Conflict minerals are Columbite-tantalite (coltan), cassiterite, gold, wolframite, or their derivatives; or any other mineral or its derivatives determined by the Secretary of State to be financing conflict in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or an adjoining country. Metals derived from these minerals are tin, tantalum, tungsten, and gold. By this definition, the only minerals of concern that may be found in Crest Metal Engineering LLP are tin and gold.

Crest Metal Engineering LLP certifies that its products are manufactured with tin and gold that is derived from material that is DRC Conflict-Free. Crest Metal Engineering LLP provides this assurance as a result of a due diligence process that includes traceability to the source and in some cases the identification of recycled and scrap materials in the supply chain.
